Expectations

I have recorded today a short assembly for students to welcome them back to school, reassuring them about asymptomatic testing and highlighting our expectations around standards of uniform and appearance, conduct and behaviour for learning. Heads of Year will direct students to this assembly so they can watch it before they return to school.

A reminder that students who do not have the correct uniform **must** bring a note in to the Head of Year (or their Form Tutor) which is signed by a parent/carer. Please can I remind you that piercings which have been done within 6 weeks must still be removed for school – plasters over piercings are <u>not</u> acceptable – and dyed hair must be returned to normal colour.

Staff will be picking up on uniform standards and punctuality (to school and lessons) with all students from Monday. Please support us by ensuring your child(ren)/ward(s) are up on time, ready for learning with all their equipment and with clean face masks, dressed in their correct school uniform.

Our school expectations have always been the three Rs: **R**eady to learn **R**espectful of others and the learning environment **R**esponsible for your actions

Staff and students worked together to write these expectations and they relate to all aspects of school life. I think they sum it up very nicely!

All students who come in full uniform (including correct PE kit in their bags if required that day) will be rewarded with 5 Praise Points by their Form Tutors for meeting our expectations. Students with enough Praise Points will be able to 'pay' for an early finish for their Year Group!





Attendance

It's really important that your child attends school every day if they are well. It's also crucial that they arrive on time. We are working hard to ensure that any gaps in students' learning are plugged as quickly and as effectively as possible following this most recent lockdown; however, we cannot do this if your child(ren) or ward(s) are not in school. Intervention and support sessions will soon start again to help with this process outside of lessons. More details to follow!

Please may I draw your attendance to the letter regarding attendance which has been sent out today? It's a brief reminder on how to let us know if your child/ward is going to be absent for any reason.
