Important information about summer assessments

The Secretary of State for Education announced on 25th February that exam boards will ask centres to generate grades for each student. These will be teacher assessed grades. Unlike last year, these grades will be awarded on student knowledge and understanding: essentially, students' actual performance as evidenced in their work.

As a school, we have carefully considered the guidance and I am pleased to confirm that we are able to share details of how students will be assessed for the awarding of grades this summer. There may be very slight variation to some of the specific plans in individual courses when exam boards release full details at the end of March. Similarly, the approach between subjects may differ slightly due to their varying demands.

The Process

This process applies to all A Level courses with the exception of Art (see separate section) and all GCSEs.

Teachers will be considering a range of sources of evidence. These may include:

- 1) Mock exams undertaken at some point within the course across the two years
- 2) Non-exam assessments (NEAs)
- 3) Internal key assessments (Exam questions, essays etc.)
- 4) Exam board sample assessments

The submission of grades to the relevant exam boards is 18/6/2021. Prior to this date, every grade for every student, must be rigorously quality assured and moderated to ensure the evidence presented to justify each grade, is robust. The time between now and the 18/6/2021, will be spent by students and teachers working hard to ensure that the evidence collected allows students to be awarded the fair grade they deserve.

Information for Art students (A Level Fine Art, Graphics and Textiles only)

In A Level Art courses, students will be assessed entirely on their portfolio of work. This includes their Personal Investigation which students have been working on since September 2020. This is a practical investigation into an idea, issue, concept or theme, supported by written material (1000-3000 words).

Grades

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The current guidance states that schools or colleges cannot share with students the grades they submit to the exam board. However, we are able to share the grades and marks for specific pieces of work.

It is important to understand that all grades issued by teachers are provisional and indicative. They will then go through subject and school quality assurance and moderation and then potentially additional exam board moderation before grades are finalised. Students' final grades will be those issued by the exam boards.
