Dear Parents and Carers,

As I write I see jubilant Y11 students before me, many of whom have completed their final assessments! It's been a long year for them and our Y13s especially and I hope they can start to look forward to their final week in school before their next exciting steps. Covid Rules in School

The Department for Education have not released any confirmation regarding the removal of bubbles and zones in Secondary schools after half term. I have therefore taken the decision that these will remain in place for the safety of students and staff. I am aware that some other schools may be operating in a slightly different way but I have been led by the guidance





throughout the pandemic and don't intend to change now. The safety of everyone is my main concern and, whilst this is not what I would want in the long term, we must do what we have to do for now. Once I have been reassured by Public Health England and the DfE that it is safe to go back to a timetable where students move from lesson to lesson, I will. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

Use of IT Equipment in School

Sadly, we have been made aware of several schools who have been specifically targeted with malicious computer software, designed to cause disruption to a computer network resulting in a significant loss of critically important data.

At Altrincham College, we invest heavily in up-to-date computer systems to ensure we are doing our very best to mitigate us from the chance of falling victim to such an attack. However, as these occurrences appear to be on the rise in the education sector, we are having to respond appropriately.

This means that **students will no longer be able to use USB storage devices in school**, nor will they be able to download and/or store certain file types to their own area of the school network.

Please would you reiterate with your child/ward the importance of acting responsibly when using school IT equipment and when logging in remotely from home.
