# Headteacher's Bulletin

Dear Parents and Carers,

I've decided not to mention a certain event happening this weekend although there will be elements associated with it in this Bulletin! I have to say I was personally more excited seeing the beautifully observed drawing by **Leonardo da Vinci** which was up for auction this week – it took my breath away! But that's just me.... I am sure I'm outnumbered by people excited about the other event!!



#### The Roof and other Refurbishment

Work will start on the roof on 21st July and will run on for several months after we return to school in September. Parking near the school from that date will be severely restricted so please do consider your child's journey in September and, if arriving/collecting by car, please park away from school and ask your child(ren) walk the rest of the way. Please also respect our neighbours by not blocking driveways, especially after school.

We also have plans to refurbish the **main school Reception** area to make it slightly smaller for visitors and to put a large Admin office in the current space, including Mr Moroney's office. We were hoping to get this work done over the summer holidays but are awaiting planning permission. We expect this to start in September now and the Sixth Form Entrance will temporarily become the Main School entrance. Please look out for signage at the front of school once the work starts.





### **Coronavirus Update**

This week we have had several positive cases identified, which resulted in a large number of students being sent home to self-isolate (please see details below). Thank you for all you support in collecting your child from school. Please can I ask that you remind your child that if they are self-isolating they must stay inside the house and NOT socialise with friends? I would also advise taking your child for a PCR test; then please inform school if the result of the PCR is positive as we may need to do further tracking and tracing.

As you know, testing has been playing a vital role in our response to the virus. It is helping to break chains of transmission by identifying asymptomatic positive cases quickly. With the increase in cases we are encouraged to continue regular testing in order to detect cases of coronavirus, stay ahead of the virus and keep Covid out of the classroom.

This means that regular lateral flow testing for all will continue, and it is recommended that staff and students who are in secondary school carry on testing at home, twice a week **throughout the Summer holidays and before returning to school in the Autumn**.

To support this, Lateral flow kits will be distributed to all staff and pupils prior to the end of term as follows:

Form time distribution	Year 7 & 8	12th July
Form time distribution	Year 9 & 10	13th July
Drop- In Collection	Year 11 - Main Reception	7th & 8th July
6th Form distribution	Year 12 - 6th Form Reception	w/c 12th July
Staff distribution	Collect from Main Reception	w/c 12th July & Inset Day

We have been informed that Lateral Flow Testing will need to be completed **twice** for every student on their return in September. Our highly efficient and friendly testing centre in the old gym will be set up again to do this as soon as students return; however, we will need to stagger the return to school to facilitate this. A letter outlining the **phased return** will be sent to you shortly.





#### Covid Cases in School This Week

Year 7

**2 Positive** Cases - 33 x Y7 close contacts = **TOTAL 33 close contacts** Year 8

**2 Positive** cases – no close contacts identified in school

2 Positive cases – 66 x Y8 + 3 x Y10 close contacts = TOTAL 69 close contacts Year 9

2 Positive Cases  $-49 \times Y9 + 1 \times Y7 + 1 \times Y8 = TOTAL 51$  close contacts

# **Overall Summary**

8 x Positive cases since Monday 5<sup>th</sup> July 2021. No staff positive cases 153 x close contacts, no staff close contacts

We currently have in total 196 students self-isolating with some due back next Monday.

Unfortunately, as a precaution, I have had to change my plans for an end of year whole school assembly due to an increase in Covid cases and we will now be holding year group assemblies only across Monday 19<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> July. These will still be fun occasions where certificates and awards will be presented, music groups will perform and our students celebrated for how wonderful they have been this year!

#### The School as a Community

It has been very difficult during the pandemic to create a whole school community 'feel' when year groups have not been allowed to mix for most of two whole academic years. I know that many Y7, Y8 and new external Y12 students will feel this the most because they have had little or no experience of the school as a whole during their time at AC. Whilst this situation is replicated across every secondary school the country, I hope that September will allow us to get that feeling back again.
