


Headteacher's Bulletin

Covid Update

Trafford currently has the highest number of Covid cases in Greater Manchester and, due to this spike in cases, the guidance for schools in Trafford has changed. From Monday I I October therefore, students (and staff) are asked to wear masks in communal areas (e.g. in the corridors between lessons). Masks do not need to be worn outside (e.g. during break and lunch) or in the classroom. Masks continue to be <u>compulsory</u> on public and school transport.

Despite this local spike, we currently have only 7 students absent due to Covid (four in Y7, two in Y8 and one in Y10); this is extremely low compared with other local schools. Our updated risk assessment on our website gives you all the latest information on how we are responding to the ongoing Covid situation.

Please can I take this opportunity to remind you that students should be doing **two LFD tests per week** and only coming into school if they are negative. Should you require further testing kits, your child can collect these from school Reception any day/time.

If your child is Clinically Extremely Vulnerable then you should contact Ms Bruckshaw who will complete an individual risk assessment for them.

Building Update

Work on the English Centre roof is going really well – we are at the messy, noisy stage as the roof is removed bit by bit and the piles are driven in. All the students should be congratulated on their behaviour at this time, respecting the restricted areas by not going near them, but above all for getting on with their work despite some noise disruption.

We will shortly be starting work on the main school Reception area. More details will follow but please be aware that **once this work begins**, the Sixth Form entrance will become the temporary main entrance and Sixth Form students will need to enter by the side door.



Does your child ride a bike to school?



Due to the building work, we will be moving the bike shed to a different area of school. We cannot fit the whole shelter in a new space therefore we will be moving the hoops only next to the steps to the History block after half term.

If your child rides a bike to school they will need to also bring a padlock and chain so that their bike can be locked to the hoops. They must dismount their bikes and walk with them down the student walkway and secure them safely in the designated area.

I must stress that bikes are **left at the student's own risk** and the school **CANNOT** take responsibility for them whilst they are there.

I would also urge you to encourage your child to **wear a helmet** – these may not be 'cool' in their minds but head injuries can kill. Please reinforce with them that health and safety comes before anything else.
