

Student 1.

I chose A' level Art as I always knew it would definitely be an option for me. After GCSE Art, I knew A 'level would be completely different. It is certainly more independent and the freedom you get allows you to develop ideas and designs more. Everybody in your art class becomes friends and help each other with different creative ideas.

I took Law and Literature as well as Art. Due to Art being more creative it gives me a chance to come and sit in the art room and do any work I have to do. Having my own art pod has definitely helped me get essays for other subjects done as can sit alone and get things done. Similarly, my art pod is a way of laying out all my work, acting as a mood board for whatever project I'm doing. It's a positive balance between academic and creative that I wouldn't have any other way.

A'level Art is so new compared to GCSE. There are so many new techniques I've learned such as wire sculptures and different ways to use paint as well as multiple different prints. The most challenging thing it trying to get it right, which takes a few tries but even if you don't get it right, those samples can be used as experimental work.

Art is a step up from GCSE meaning its more challenging. But your classmates and Mr Miranda always help to take the edge of the best they can. Someone is always there to help you if you need it. Mr Miranda always gives you creative ideas and pushes you to be a better artist.

A'level Art was a huge factor for me when applying for university. I've applied to do Interior Architecture at Salford which for any art based or media course all unis ask for a portfolio. I attended Altrincham College throughout my high school years, when looking at sixth forms and colleges I decided I 100% wanted a change of environment and a chance to meet new people. So initially I applied to South Trafford College and was accepted a place. I started studying A' level courses there for a couple of weeks. By reflection on my decision, I made the choice that actually, I don't think college is right for me.
