Raising Awareness!

February is LGBTQ+ History month and this year marks the 50th Anniversary of the first Pride march in the UK. Over the Spring Term the LGBTQ+ Space have been looking at aspects of LGBTQ+ History; this has included chatting about our own Queer Icons from Michelle Visage to Alan Turing and the history of the Pride Flag.

To reflect that this anniversary is one on a continuing and often winding journey towards full equality, which has suffered many setbacks while still moving forwards, LGBTQ+ History took 'the arc is long' as their tagline, from Dr Martin Luther King Jnr's quote "The arc of the moral universe is long but it bends towards justice". The LGBTQ+ Space who meet on Monday from 3.20-4.20pm in the SSC have looked at some aspects of that "arc". The Year 7s, with support from the Year 9s, have put together a quiz which has been shared with the school. The Year 10 and 11 students looked at influential members of the LGBTQ+ community through history and looked for those who are still making history. From this they produced an assembly which was presented to Year 7 and 8 by the Year 10s and to the Year 11s by their peers.

The platforms young people use are spaces for connection, community and collaboration, which is why the Day challenges them to foster supportive relationships and respectful communities, whilst equipping them with the skills they need to keep themselves and others safe in these spaces.

Message from our Computer Science/ICT Department:

Calling all budding entrepreneurs, digital artists, game creators, web designers and programmers!

This term the Computing and ICT department are introducing a new homework initiative for all students. We will be asking all students to register and begin a vocational qualification called the Inspiring Digital Enterprise Award, known as iDEA. This is an international award-winning programme that helps young people to develop digital, enterprise and employability skills for free.

Through a series of online challenges, you can win career-enhancing badges, unlock new opportunities and, ultimately, gain industry-recognised awards which will help you stand out from the crowd. You could choose from hundreds of challenges; for example, you could create and code your own game, create a website, develop an entrepreneurial idea or complete a course on on-line safety

To achieve the Bronze Award, a total of 250 points have to be earnt. To earn points, students have to complete badges, 5 to 10 points are awarded for each badge.

We would really like it if KS3 students could try and collect five badges by the end of the half term holiday!
