The Achieve and Learn Trust believes that nothing is more important than safeguarding the young people in our schools.

With the current Government conversation around the use of mobile phones by young people, we thought it was a good time to revisit the appropriate use of social media and how parents can have supportive conversations to promote resilience in their children.

Advice for parents of pre-teens and teens

- **Follow age requirements** - Many popular Apps, sites and games are 13+, it's important to check and follow these with pre-teens.
- **Speak to phone providers** - If your child owns their own smartphone then contact the service provider to make sure it is registered as a child's device. This means additional safety restrictions can be put in place.
- **Support your child with their settings** - Support your child to manage their safety and wellbeing settings across devices and accounts.
- **Focus on regular safety conversations** - It's important to keep conversations regular at this age. Check the NSPCC advice on [tackling challenging conversations](#) including tips for how to use technology to support you with this.
- **Share youth facing help and support** - Make sure your child knows about services that can help like Childline. You could start by sharing the [online safety advice content](#) and the [Report Remove tool](#) created by the IWF and Childline.
- **Revisit parental controls** - you will likely need to revisit your parental controls again at this age and adjust them. Keep checking these regularly to make sure they are in place.
- **Explore healthy habits together** - Healthy habits work best when all the family agrees to following them. This could be agreeing to charge devices away from beds to support sleep and not using devices during mealtimes to help take breaks.

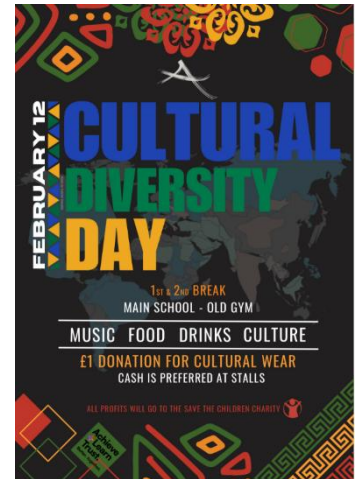
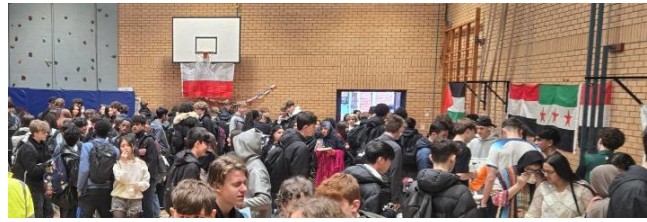

Key Stage 5 and Year 11 'Learning to Learn' Programme

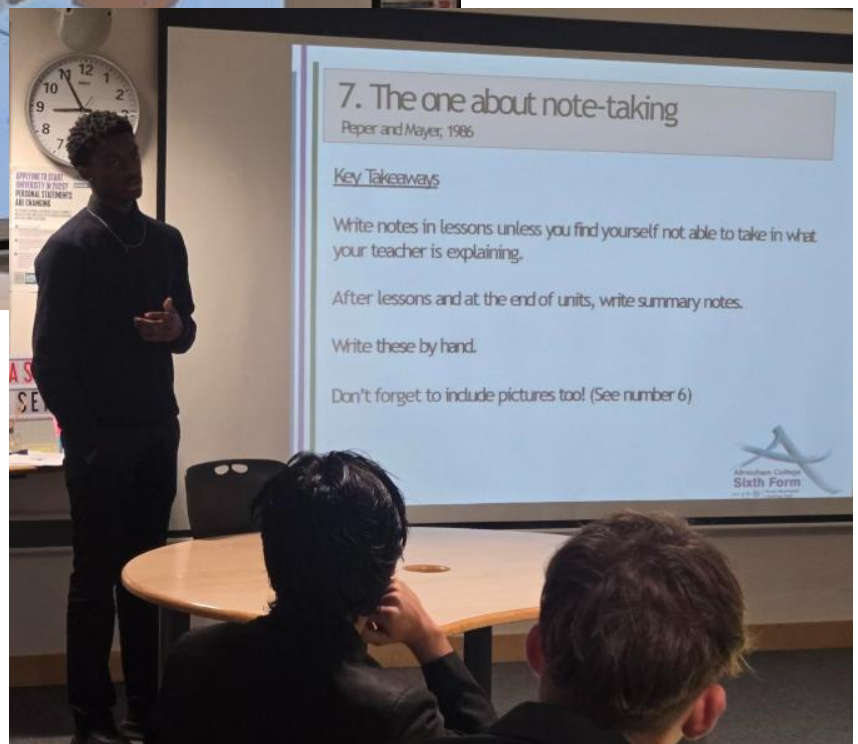
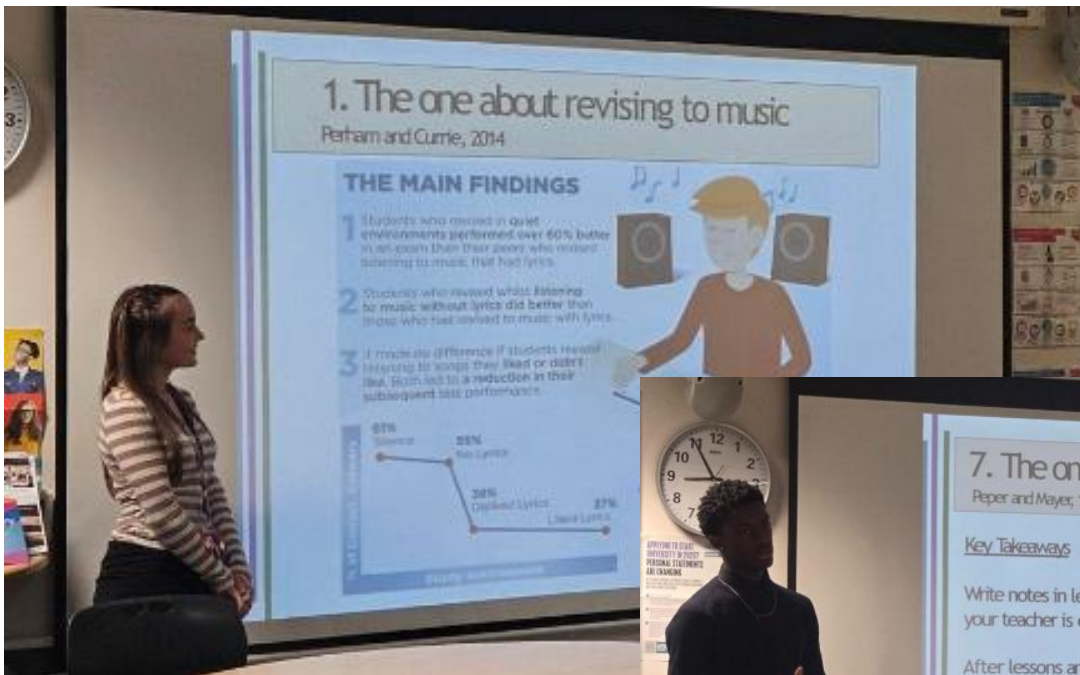

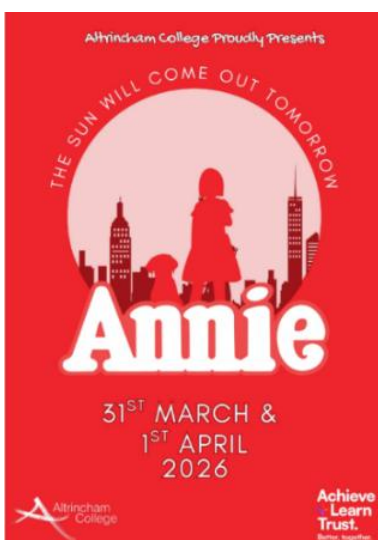


Pentathlon event

Textiles

Year 7 Trip to Macclesfield Silk Museum and Paradise Mill

We enjoyed a memorable and educational visit to the Macclesfield Silk Museum, where students explored the town's rich silk-making heritage. The visit marked their very first school trip as secondary school pupils, making it a special milestone for the year group.

A standout moment was the visit to Paradise Mill, the last remaining silk factory in Macclesfield, which offered fascinating insights into an important part of local and national history.



During the tour, students were able to see the original looms and silk machinery in full working order, bringing the process of silk production to life. Museum staff explained how the mill operated, the skills required to work there, and the conditions experienced by the workers in the past. Pupils listened carefully,

asked thoughtful questions and showed great curiosity as they learned about the history of the mill and the people who worked within it.



The visit also included a creative print workshop, where students designed and created their own prints inspired by traditional silk patterns. This hands-on activity allowed everyone to explore their creativity while linking art and design to the historical context of silk production. After the workshop, pupils toured the museum, discovering further exhibits and deepening their understanding of Macclesfield's role in the silk industry.



To round off the day, students took part in an engaging quiz. Well done to Emily, Evie E, Poppy, Matilda, Ellie, Sruthika, Evie C, Eadie, and Olivia, who worked brilliantly as a team to win the quiz.

The museum staff were full of praise for our students and Mrs Woods, Ms O'Brien, and Mrs Deighton were incredibly proud of their excellent behaviour, enthusiasm, and maturity. – Mrs Woods

Art: 3D artist workshop
