Work Experience

Students in Year 10 and Year 12 will have a fantastic opportunity to participate in Work Experience. It will allow them to gain an insight into life in the workplace and the demands which will be placed upon them when they enter employment after they have completed their education.

Year 10 and Year 12 students will need to contact employers to <u>find their own</u> <u>placements</u> and complete all the relevant forms that have been given to the students already. Year 12's week is 2-6th March and Year 10's week is 6-10th July. They will need to ensure they ask the employer to provide a copy of the **Employers Liability Insurance Certificate (ELI)**. Once forms have been handed into reception by the deadline dates below, they will be checked and safety will be assessed by Our Futures Ltd.

Written confirmation will be sent to inform you if the placement can go ahead. We would ask for a voluntary contribution of £5 per student to support a little towards the admin costs, this is available on Parent Pay now for year 12's and will be for year 10's once the students placement has been confirmed.

The deadline to find a placement and return the complete forms including the ELI certificate is:

Year 12 - 1st November 2019

Year 10 - 13th December 2019

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Parking:

There have been a number of issues recently with parking outside school. Inconsiderate parking is causing issues for the traffic flow particularly down Green Lane and is causing inconveniences for our neighbours.

Please can we kindly request that if collecting your child by car that you:

- Do not block the bus lanes
- Do not block private driveways
- Do not park on yellow lines outside school
- Do not double park another vehicle (especially near the garden centre)
- Do not park on road corner (especially on Kenmore Drive this creates difficulty in viewing the junction
- Minimal amount of vehicle on pavement so not to block the pavement
