
An Evening with Chris Watson

In November, we welcomed Chris Watson into school and he delivered sessions to students about his work and also hosted a paid event in the evening to showcase his work.

Watson was a founding member of the influential Sheffield based experimental music group Cabaret Voltaire during the late 1970's and early 1980's. Since then he has developed a particular and passionate interest in recording the wildlife sounds of animals and habitats from around the world. As a freelance composer and sound recordist Watson specialises creating spatial sound installations which feature a strong sense and spirit of place.



His television work includes many programmes in the David Attenborough 'Life' series including 'The Life of Birds' which won a BAFTA Award for 'Best Factual Sound' in 1996, and as the location sound recordist for the BBC series 'Frozen Planet' which also won a BAFTA Award for 'Best Factual Sound' (2012).



Watson has recorded and featured in many BBC Radio 4 and World Service productions including 'The Wire' which won him the Broadcasting Press Guild's Broadcaster of the Year Award (2012). His music is regularly featured on the BBC Radio 3 programme 'Late Junction' and he has also worked extensively for RTE Radio 1 on series such as 'Sound Stories'

In 2013 Watson received a Paul Hamlyn Composers Award.

His installations have been commissioned by international galleries and festivals such as Sheffield Millennium Gallery, Opera North in Leeds, The National Gallery, London, The Louvre, Paris, the Aichi Triennial in Japan and Unsound in Kraków.

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Child Criminal Exploitation Day: Thursday 5th December

On Thursday 5th December we were delighted to invite Gorse Hill Studios into Altrincham College to work with staff and students on heightening the awareness of Child Criminal Exploitation and County Lines. Staff were given training on how to recognise signs of CCE amongst young people and how to report concerns and support them. Year 9 students took part in workshops through out the day on recognising vulnerabilities in each other and the support available. We were also treated to a performance of the play "Lines" in the afternoon which dealt with the grooming aspect of County Lines and heightened staff and students awareness of how the process starts and the possible outcomes for young people. This was an important piece of work with our young people in developing their resilience and awareness of County Lines gangs and the dangers becoming involved.

Work Experience—Student Feedback and Evaluation:

Year 11 students received feedback forms from the employers and they have evaluated the experience themselves. In the new year, Year 11's will be creating and updating their CV's, so please start thinking about things you could include in yours

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PE Successes

The term kicked off with lots of football and netball fixtures. We had mixed fortunes in the Trafford football leagues, with several cancelled fixtures, however the Year 7 & 9 teams performed well. Some brilliant results from the netball teams this term. Year 7 performed brilliantly in their first year in their netball league and Year 8 remained unbeaten in their netball league.

Cross Country Event:

A team attended the Trafford Cross Country championships in December and we performed extremely well as a team, with runners making a fantastic effort to complete the challenging course. Many runners finished in the top 30, with some stand out performances

Golf Reward Trip:

Finally we introduced a termly, sports, reward trip for outstanding effort and achievement in PE during the term. We took 12 students from Years 7-9 to Ringway golf club to experience a coaching session from the club professional. The students really enjoyed the afternoon learning the basic skills and taking part in a chipping competition.

Sixth Form Update:

Our Year 13 students have been working very hard this term on their university and apprenticeship applications. Congratulations to the students who have already completed their UCAS application ahead of the deadline. Many have received offers or invitations to interview at universities such as Oxford, Durham, Warwick, Liverpool, Glasgow, Manchester, Leeds, MMU, Salford and more! Three students have also been offered degree apprenticeships. Some of our students who are working on their EPQ's (Extended Project Qualification), recently enjoyed a trip to the University of Manchester where they were taught how to research academic texts and online journals.

Well done to our Year 12 students who have successfully secured work experience placements at companies such as the BBC, Global Media, BUPA, Slater Heelis, to name just a few.
